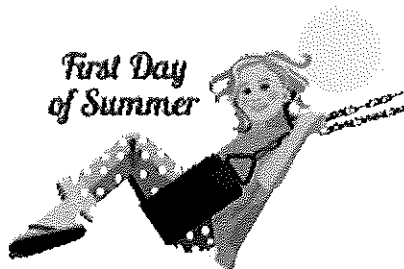

From Pastor Mark

Fairview welcomed Ken Priddy in April to challenge and assist us as a church community to build our "Great Commission Matrix." Our goal is to answer the question "How does God want to express himself through Fairview in this community and at this time?" This is an important question for Fairview at this time in her history as a church. For the past several years our leadership team, the Session, focused its energies upon the transition process from our former denomination into the Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC). We were received into the EPC a little more than two years ago. Now is the time to address the question as to how God intends to express himself through the life and ministry of Fairview Evangelical Presbyterian Church at this time and in this community. We are grateful to Rev. Priddy for the concrete guidance he has provided for us as we seek to answer this question.

The Session will establish a Vision Team to help us as a church move forward in this. The Vision Team will be six in number: myself, as Fairview's pastor, one or two ruling elders from the Session, and other leaders from the church. The Vision Team's job will be to pray and discern God's Great Commission Vision for Fairview. It will also be responsible for developing a strategy to pursue that vision and helping the church begin to implement the strategy and evaluate the results. Serving on the Vision Team will involve commitment. We anticipate that it will meet at least twice a month.

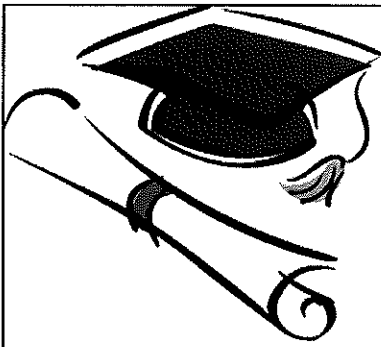
What sort of people do we need for the Vision Team? Vision Team members must be spiritually discerning and have a sense of vision as to how God is and will be at work in the life and ministry of Fairview church. Vision Team members must be spiritually mature and be well respected by the people of Fairview. The Vision Team needs credibility and authority to make decisions and move our church forward.

Behind the work of the Vision Team will be the prayer teams recruited to support the Vision Team in its work. Prayer is the first thing that we do as we seek God's hand of guidance leading us.

So, if you know someone you would recommend to be considered to be on the Vision Team, please speak to me or to one of the Session members. You may be asked to serve on the team, or on one of the support prayer teams. I encourage you, if asked, to say "Yes." Discerning the next step in our community life together as a church will be a team effort. Ask God to speak to your heart. What role might you play?

On Sunday, June 7, following worship, the Session will be hosting a special gathering for the purpose of determining the membership of the Vision Team and its prayer support teams. It will also take whatever additional steps needed to get things going. If you would like to be a part of this effort, mark your calendar and plan to join with us after worship on June 7th.

“Hang Up Your Mittens”

FEPC is heated via 4 vertical boilers that are well over 20 years old. Two of them are not working and 1 is not working at full capacity. We do not know how long they will last. It is not possible to repair them, and new boilers are far more energy efficient. Jay Hayes monitors the boiler’s performance on a daily basis. Not knowing when they will stop working is a great concern to the Trustees and there is now a plan to make sure the temperature at FEPC is as warm as our congregation’s welcome. Working with an expert, a detailed plan of the work needed was created. It was sent along with a Request for Proposal to several commercial

heating businesses. While a final award for the work has not been made, we do know that the cost will be approximately \$40,000. FEPC has \$15,000 available for capital expenses and fund raising activities have begun to raise the other \$25,000.

We request that you prayerfully consider a pledge of any amount towards this important project so we won’t need to wear mittens in church next winter. The Pledge Mitten forms are available in the church foyer and on the website.

<p>The Deacon’s Fund offering will take place the fourth Sunday of every month. Envelopes for this purpose are located in the pew racks. These funds, as in the past, will be used to assist our family members at FEPC who are in need of assistance. 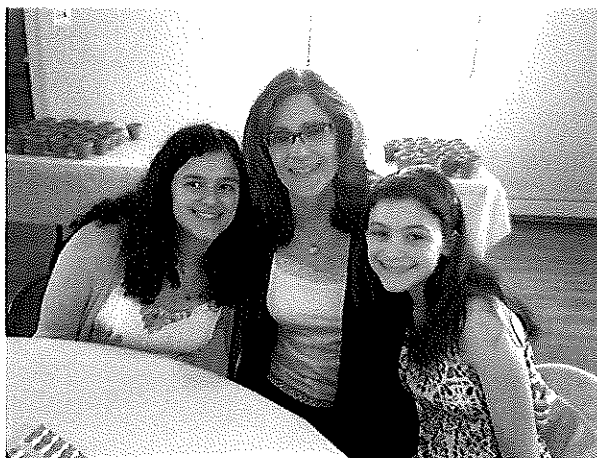

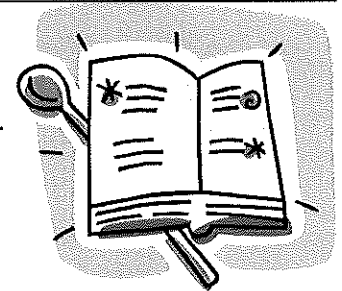

On Christmas Eve, Good Works homeowner Eugene (Gene) Sabbi lost his home in a devastating fire due to a mishap with his wood burning stove. He received 2nd degree burns to hands and arms and lost his dog Elsa, a one-year old boxer pup in the inferno.

According to eye witnesses, the old timber home was engulfed in flames within 45 minutes. Gene lost everything in the blaze and is temporarily living with his daughter in a local mobile home park. Good Works was in the process of repairing his home earlier in the month and news of the fire came as a shock to everyone involved. On Christmas morning, Gene found himself in the hospital being treated for burns he received in the fire. The charred remains of his home were a stark reminder of the terror he experienced the day before. It is difficult to imagine losing everything....your home, your furniture, your photographs and important papers...everything.

Gene is a 75 year old Chester County native and served his country in the Pennsylvania National Guard as a young man.

Good Works has completed clean-up of the site and is initiating construction of a new home for Gene on the property. Engineering analysis, architectural plans, and building permits have been approved. The new, two bedroom, single story design will sit atop the original foundation and provide Gene a safe, secure and energy efficient home.

This is no small feat and we are calling on all Good Works supporters and friends of the Sabbi family to help "crowdfund" the project.

Together, we can raise the \$45,000 to build a new home for Gene.

After a busy summer day, relax in the shade with this cool drink.




What you need:

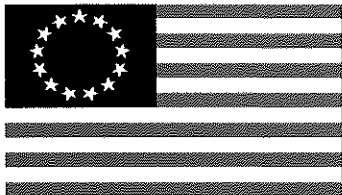

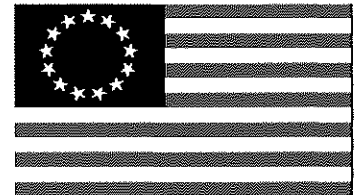

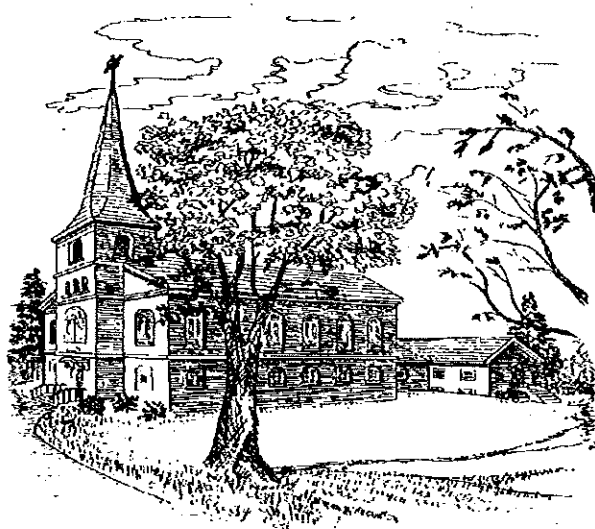
- Bulletin news is to be at the office no later than Wednesday, noon.
