#### From Pastor Mark

What does Pastor Mark do during the week?

Have you ever wondered how Pastor Mark spends his time during the week? Here is a list of some of the things that have filled my days *this* week.

Sunday: I arrived at church at 7:30 am and read through out loud the adult class, liturgy and sermon; taught the New Member's Discipleship Class; led worship; and Lois Ann and I hosted a couple from Fairview for Sunday lunch. Later in the afternoon I mourned Green Bay's loss to Detroit.

Monday: took the next steps in implementing the work of the Vision Team regarding how Fairview makes disciples. This required (this week) updating the New Member's Discipleship Class and reworking the Session Meeting Agenda. I was supposed to meet with a Pakistani friend for lunch, but he was called away at the last minute to be with a family member who is ill. I planned the coming Sunday's worship program.

Tuesday: met with a woman to answer her questions about theology and cremation. Prepared my parts for the coming Sunday's worship service. In the afternoon Lois Ann and I provided pastoral care to a couple. I was supposed to attend the meeting of the Vision Team that evening, but I asked to be excused as Lois Ann and I had to address a (different) pastoral care emergency that evening. I prepared numerous documents related to next week's Session meeting.

Wednesday: attended a breakfast in Gap to explore with other (mainly) Presbyterian pastors and elders the possibility of creating a local Reformation Society. Interspersed through Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday I do the research on the Bible text we will study together on Sunday; I develop the outline for the message - this is the most important and demanding part of my sermon preparation.

Thursday: is sermon writing day. I also wrote this pastor's column. I pray every morning as I get going in the office. Among other prayers, I flip the page on the EPC world outreach prayer guide and pray for the missionaries listed.

Friday: I try to take off - though not always successfully. Lois Ann reads my sermon and gives her valuable and much needed corrections and feedback. This week we also had dinner with a Fairview family.

Saturday: I am in the office in the morning and revise the sermon based on Lois Ann's input. I prepare the preaching text that comes with me into the pulpit and prep the Power Point outline. I review the New Member's Discipleship Power Point. When I leave the office, everything I need for Sunday is on my desk, ready to go.

And, I read every night. I read theology and history, to be sure, and I keep up on the news of the day. But I also deliberately seek to read material from folk who are not believers, not in the Christian community. For example, this week I read the latest issue of Marie Claire! I subscribe to a New Age newsletter and I look over the headlines of the articles and may print out in order to read those that seem to reflect the thinking of the non-Christian world around us.


#### Men's Fellowship





# BETHLEHEM


Make a mobile to remind you of Jesus' birth.

#### What you need:

- Paper plate
- Hole punch
- Thin blue ribbon
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Yellow craft foam
- Marker

### What you do:

- 1. With the paper plate upside down, punch evenly spaced holes along the rim. Gently fold the plate and punch a hole in the center.
- 2. Cut pieces of ribbon, thread them through the holes as desired and tie the ribbons securely.
- 3. Trace several small stars and one larger star on the foam and cut them out. Punch a hole atop a point of each star.
- 4. Tie one small star to each outer-rim ribbon.
- 5. Thread a longer ribbon through the center hole and tie the large star to the other end.
- 6. Write a verse on the plate or large star. Hang the mobile from the ceiling with another piece of blue ribbon.


